Trumpeter Swan Contest



Trumpeter Swans have visited the Schildberg Quarry for, at least, Thirteen out of the last fourteen winters. Most Trumpeter Swans migrate farther south for the winter in search of open water and food. Because of the depth of Atlantic's Schildberg Quarry, and the large number of wading waterfowl, it remains open year round, making it possible for the swans to stay. Only one injury last year, to a cygnets leg, it was taken to SOAR to recover, it was released near the end of the spring migration. Last season we had an average of 28 visit, and the most on one day was 42! Arrival and departure dates of the Trumpeter Swans have been as follows:

The Cass County Conservation Board is asking you...When do you think the first Trumpeter Swan will arrive at the Schildberg Quarry? Please call in your prediction (beginning October 1st) to the Conservation Board at 712-769-2372, leave a message and return phone number if we are not in. Duplicate dates will not be allowed. For example, if a caller predicts November 25th, no one else will be allowed to predict that arrival date. **So, call anytime during the month of October until November 11th to make your prediction!** One prediction per family, please. The sponsors of this contest will determine the official arrival of the swans. The winner will receive a Trumpeter Swan 8x10 Print from the Cass County Conservation Board. This contest is strictly for residents of Cass County.

The fish will really start biting again as they begin to put on weight for the up coming winter, and like the camping in our parks, there should be no problems running into to many other fisherman so you should have your pick of the best spots on the water.

Hunting seasons have already begun; dove season is well underway (the first dove season in Iowa history) as well as squirrel and rabbit seasons are currently open. Archery deer season opens up soon (October 1, as well as fall turkey season (October 10). At the end of October pheasant and quail season opens up as well.

It is also just a wonderful time to get out to one of our areas and do some bird watching, fall migrations have begun, and were are seeing more waterfowl at our parks. Wildlife is becoming more visible as well, as the crops start to come out.

So I just encourage everyone to get out and enjoy one of our parks. If you just enjoy a nice quite walk, camping, hunting/fishing, or watching wildlife, give us a call if you have any questions we'd be happy to give you some ideas for a wonderful day or weekend at one of our parks!

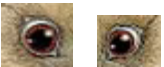

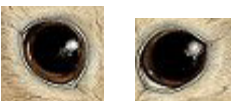

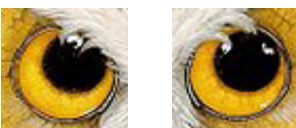

All Cass County Programs are FREE unless otherwise stated! Donations for programs are accepted.

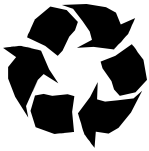
