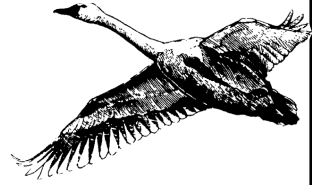

## Trumpeter Swans in Cass County

Forty Trumpeter Swans were over-wintering at the Schildberg Quarry in northwest Atlantic on 1/7/12. Three of them are marked (with red or green collars), making it possible to keep track of their travels. All three of the marked swans have previously over-wintered at Schildberg Quarry. Our highest number of swans for the year is 40, see the above date. Other wintering sites are FULL, like Beemer's pond West of Webster City, IA has over 175 Trumpeter Swans on 12/29/11. The LAST handful of 5th annual Soiree with the Swans long sleeved t-shirts are still for sale, Marked down XL \$10 and 2XL/3XL are \$10, Stop up at our office and pick one up TODAY!! The swans arrival was Nov 17th.

**5C5** is a male from West Bend, IA. He has been coming to the Schildberg quarry for seven winters now. He has stuck around all this year, compared to last year he was only here for November.

**5H5**, a male of Blaine Behnken's captive pair, after being released at Lake Anita on 4/6/05. He has been here for six winters now in Atlantic, IA, their nest site is unknown.

**6H9**, is a female 6H9 and 5H5 hatched at least 5 cygnets in both 2007 and 2008. Their nest location is unknown. This year you'll notice they have 6 cygnets!!

## Great Backyard Bird Count

The National Audubon Society & Cornell Lab of Ornithology needs every bird enthusiast in North America to count birds February 17th-20th. All you need is a basic knowledge of bird identification! This activity is extremely easy...you watch the birds in your yard, local park, or other natural area for 15 minutes or more and use a tally sheet to record the highest number of individual birds that you see in view at one time. There are two ways to participate in the bird count, 1. Call the Conservation Board at 712-769-2372 and we will send you everything you need or (you may pick it up in our office) 2. You can visit the Great Backyard Bird Count website at <http://www.birdsource.org/gbbc> and submit your results from there. This is a great family event and the data collected will be used by scientists to analyze bird populations. If you are new to the count please see the Upcoming Programs on the next page. Since 2002 the Cass County Conservation Board has advertised this bird count throughout the county encouraging citizens to participate. Last year we had a strong second place behind Adel at 102, but out of the top three we had the most number of species. We were not the highest number of species recorded by a town overall but a strong showing! Congratulations Cass County on a wonderful response!
